## Android's Hidden Language

While not covered in our references, Android manufacturers use similar coding:

Samsung's SM-G998U (Galaxy S21 Ultra 5G) breaks down into series (G=Galaxy), generation (998), and carrier (U=Unlocked)

Google's GX7AS uses letters to denote color variants and storage capacities

## Why Should You Care?

Understanding model numbers helps you:

Spot counterfeit devices (that "iPhone 15 Pro" with an A12 chip? Red flag!)

Identify regional variants for better carrier compatibility

Make informed buying decisions between generations

Troubleshoot device-specific issues accurately

Next time you're device shopping, remember: that model number isn't random - it's the product's resume in shorthand. Whether you're comparing iPhone XS camera specs or Xbox cooling systems, these codes hold the key to making tech-savvy choices.
